Subject: Waitlist Process Available for Academic Year 2023-2024



Hello Sebastian the Ibis ,

Our records indicate you submitted a 2023-2024 application for on-campus housing but did not secure a space. As previously indicated in our last communication on February 22nd, the waitlist process is now open.

Action is required by March 5th at 11:59 PM to join the waitlist. Log into the [Housing Portal](#) to view the options:

Option A: Remain an active applicant. You must opt into this choice if you wish to be considered for on-campus housing on or before Sunday, March 5th at 11:59pm. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

Option B: Cancel your housing application. Submit a Cancellation Request Form prior to Sunday, March 5th at 11:59pm. Those who cancel without a housing assignment will NOT be assessed any penalty.

Some things to keep in mind about the waitlist process:

- Priority is not based on when the waitlist request is submitted. Placement will be determined at random, similar to how appointment times were issued during the room selection process.
- Waitlist requests are treated at the individual level and not the group level. You will come off the waitlist individually and be notified as a space becomes available in units. Students who wish to receive group accommodations may submit room change requests only after they have been assigned a space. It is not likely group requests will be accommodated when students come off the waitlist as individual spaces within units become available. Once students are assigned to campus, they can submit a room change request to request a move with other students.
- Eligibility for the various waitlists will depend on a student's status. Rising Sophomores will be eligible for Eaton/Lakeside Village. Rising Juniors/Seniors will be eligible for University Village.
- Those who opt to add their name to the waitlist process may cancel their request and remove their name at any time within the waitlist summary page. When a student cancels their housing application it will also remove them from any waitlist process they were a part of.

Students who do not express their continued interest by Sunday, March 5th OR formally request cancellation of their housing application on their own will have their application administratively cancelled.

We encourage students who were unable to secure on-campus housing during the room selection process to begin looking at possible off-campus alternatives. Our Off Campus [website](#) is helpful to find off-campus housing listings, roommate resources, and a guide including information on leasing. There are also dedicated housing professional staff members who can assist you in navigating these options and you can

request assistance with your off-campus housing search by emailing housinghelp@miami.edu. We will have more information in the days ahead on an Off Campus Housing fair on campus that will showcase some of these off-campus properties and allow students to engage in conversation about their availability.

We thank you for your continued patience throughout this process. We are committed to doing the best we can to place students who remain interested in on campus housing.
